ADOPTED County Policies for 2011

CHECK-IN TIME: 4:00 p.m.
CHECK - OUT TIME: 2:00 p.m

I. Vehicle Parking

- a) One vehicle per campsite at no charge.
- b) Extra vehicles shall be charged \$3.00 per day, including vehicles driven to the campsite by visitors.
- c) Extra vehicles and visitor parking in parking lot at no charge.

(The above policy was adopted in order to eliminate congestion in the camping area. At the option of the Park Manager, all extra vehicles parking in the campground area may be suspended. Please park extra vehicles in the parking lots.)

II. Advance Registration

- a) Advance registration permitted in County Parks #1, #2, #3, #5 and #7 Registrations must be for 7 or more continuous days.
- b) Deposit and registration fees for **daily** campsites: payment must be made **in full** within 10 days of the date registration was made.

Seasonal camper's registrations: (campers who have stayed at that particular park or 30/90 days from the past season) will be given priority signup beginning at 8:00 a.m., the first Saturday following January 1st until January 31. **PHONE REGISTRATIONS ONLY.** After that date it will be on a first come, first serve basis for all campers. Park Managers will have the discretion to place campers where they deem appropriate to meet the needs of the campers and camp sites.

Seasonal camping registration fee: 50% of the total registration fee is due within 10 days of the date the reservation is made. The remaining balance is due by March 1st or the reservation will be cancelled and the deposit will be forfeited. Payment in full also accepted.

- c) No refunds for cancelled reservations.

III. Camper Storage

In Season Camper Storage – Unattended camper storage permitted at Parks #1, #2, and #3. Unit must be removed from campsite to a designated storage area. Storage fees shall be \$3.00 per day.

IV. Dogs

Dogs with aggressive or vicious tendencies are not allowed in Kandiyohi County Parks nor are wild or exotic animals including, without limitation, bears, wolves, lions, cougars, bobcats or other large carnivores. Persons with such animals will be required to remove the animal immediately. Failure to do so will result in loss of all park privileges. Any person not leaving upon demand of the park manager shall be considered a trespasser.

Campers failing to clean up after pets can be charged a fee for clean up by park managers. Dog's fees are \$1.00 per dog/per day.

V. Park #2: Wildlife Management area access from park

During the camping season only registered campers shall have access to and from the Fish and Wildlife Management area that is adjoining to Kandiyohi County Park 2. No drive through access will be allowed. Upon the closure of the park, at the end of the camping season, access to the Fish and Wildlife Management area will be allowed by foot and through the designated entrance areas. Individuals accessing the Fish and Wildlife Management area must have Firearms encased and unloaded at all times while on park property. All hunting laws must be followed.

VI. CAMPING

1. The camping permit shall be filled out at time of entry.
2. Units may be left unattended for a period not to exceed 48 hours, except monthly units at Park #1, #2, #3, and #5.
3. Visitors shall be instructed to park vehicles in the parking lot and not at the camping site.
4. One family camping unit allowed per registration permit.
5. Generators not allowed when electricity is provided.
6. The total number of camping registrations allowed at any one time shall be:

VII. SHELTERS

1. Shelters shall not be reserved prior to January 1 for the forthcoming park season.
2. A \$30.00 advance registration fee shall be charged.

VIII. FIREWOOD

Must be purchased by an authorized agent OR bears evidence that it is from a DNR approved source and/or an MDA certified firewood dealer.

Kandiyohi County's policy on firewood is to help prevent the spread of diseased trees into Kandiyohi County. More information from the MN DNR can be found on the following link <http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/firewood/index.html>

APPROVED FIREWOOD

- ◆ Firewood sold to visitors at DNR facilities.



- ◆ Firewood purchased from an **approved DNR firewood vendor** with 100 miles of where you will use it. **Be sure to keep your receipt to show proof of purchase.**
- ◆ Firewood purchased from a DNR approved firewood vendor which has been treated in a kiln certified by the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) to meet federal standards. The firewood will carry the MDA shield on its label. **Be sure to keep your receipt to show proof of purchase.**



◆ Firewood purchased from a DNR approved firewood vendor which has been debarked as per federal standards (100% of the bark & ½” of the sapwood has been removed). **Be sure to keep your receipt to show proof of purchase.**

◆ Kiln-dried, unpainted, unstained dimensional lumber (such as 2x4 or 4x6 scraps from a building project) free of metal or other foreign substances. **Pallet wood is not approved firewood.** Dimensional lumber does not require proof of purchase.



To find a **firewood vendor approved for your state land destination**, check the DNR **approved firewood vendor listing**. If you have any questions, please call the Park Manager.

VIII. GOLF CART POLICY

Golf Carts can be used until 8:00 p.m. at County Park #2 and County Park #3 and no one under the age of 16 can operate the cart.

Golf Carts can be used at County Parks #1, #5 and #7 for elderly disability/medical use only and no one under the age of 16 can operate the cart.

If ANY part of this agreement is violated and/or misused the policy will be suspended and all suspensions will be final at ALL parks.

Campers should check with Park Managers at the time of registration regarding golf cart rules for that park.

KANDIYOHI COUNTY PARK POLICY

DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR

It shall be the policy of Kandiyohi County to insure that the experience of visiting a Kandiyohi County park will be enjoyable for all visitors. Therefore, in order to insure that all visitors may enjoy the benefits of the park experience to the fullest extent possible, the Kandiyohi County Board of Commissioners declares the following policy:

1. No person shall engage in loud, boisterous, disruptive or criminal behavior in any Kandiyohi County park. Such behavior includes, without limitation: any violation of law punishable as a crime, public intoxication, consumption of alcoholic beverages by underage individuals, discharge of illegal fireworks, dog or other companion animals running at large, public nudity, music or loud noise which disturbs the repose of other park visitors between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., internal combustion engines with unmuffled or loud exhaust, peeping or intrusive behavior, or littering.

2. Persons engaging in disruptive behavior shall be warned by the park manager or his or her designee to cease such behavior immediately. If the person or persons so warned fails to stop the disruptive behavior, the park manager may order that the individual leave the county park immediately, and provide the individual with a trespass notice, banning the person or persons from the park for a period of one year. Any park entry fees paid shall not be refunded.

3. Persons who are banned from the park shall be given a written trespass notice that they are to leave the park immediately, which notice shall further state they will not be permitted to return for a period of one year, and further state that return within that time will be considered a criminal trespass. The notice shall provide that, during the period of the ban, the person or persons are banned from all Kandiyohi County parks. The notice shall further provide that the individual may contact the Kandiyohi County Administrator and request a Due Process Hearing before the Administrator, at which time the person may

offer any evidence tending to refute, excuse or mitigate the reasons for being banned from the park. The Kandiyohi County Administrator shall hear the evidence presented by such person or persons, and that presented by the park manager, and determine whether the ban shall continue, and/or adjust the duration of the ban. A copy of the notice advising the person to leave the county park shall be provided to the Kandiyohi County Sheriff.

4. Persons who return to any Kandiyohi County park contrary to the notice banning them from the parks shall be considered trespassers, the Kandiyohi County Sheriff shall be summoned immediately and the person or persons shall be dealt with according to law.

Minnesota law (Minn. Stat.609.605) provides that no person shall intentionally trespass on the land of another or refuse to depart from that land, without a legal basis, when a demand to do so is made by the lawful possessor or his/her agent. Such demand may be spoken or written. No person who has received a demand to stay off such land shall reenter it within 1 (one) year from the date of the demand without the written permission of the lawful possessor or the agent who provided the demand. Violators may be subject to imprisonment for 90 (ninety) days or to a fine of \$1,000, or both.
